# Draft work programme on Suppressed Demand Guidelines

---

## Background:

- EB 62 adopted the “Guidelines on the consideration of suppressed demand in CDM methodologies”;
- EB 62 tasked the secretariat to prepare a draft work programme in consultation with the relevant panels and working groups for the improvement and the implementation of the guideline.



# Draft work programme on Suppressed Demand Guidelines

---

- The work programme took into account the recommendations of the Meth Panel and the SSC WG
- Has two areas of work:
  1. Application of the guidelines to relevant methodologies in the form of draft revisions where necessary;
  2. Further improvement of clarity and level of detail contained in the guidelines, taking into account:
    1. Guidance from the Board;
    2. Inputs from Panels/WG;
    3. Public inputs.



# Draft work programme on Suppressed Demand Guidelines

---

Application to existing methodologies:

1. Scanning of methodologies to identify:
  - If SD is relevant;
  - If it has been addressed or not;
2. Methodology revision prioritised based on:
  - Whether minimum service level (e.g. basic energy services, drinking water supply, waste treatment/disposal) is pertinent to the methodology;
  - Whether methodology belongs to a priority sector defined by the Board (EB 51, annex 11);
  - Potential of the methodology to contribute to the enhanced regional distribution of CDM (evident from inputs from DNAs, stakeholder consultations and practitioner inputs);
  - Usage of the methodology or indications of usage based on inputs from PP community or requests for revision/clarification received.



# Draft work programme on Suppressed Demand Guidelines

---

3. Defining the minimum service level in methodologies
  - a) International/national studies/reports e.g. *UN Energy reports and Chapter 8: Energy Poverty of World Energy Outlook 2010 - Global Energy Trends by the International Energy Agency.*
4. Inputs from stakeholders and practitioners:
  - a) Teleconferences;
  - b) Call for public inputs including comments on draft revisions;
  - c) Dedicated methodology workshops.
5. The draft revised methodologies will then be proposed for consideration by the relevant Panel/Working group.



# Draft work programme on Suppressed Demand Guideline

---

2. Revision of the suppressed demand guidelines
  - The improvements may include:
    - a) Further guidance on the minimum service level, including data vintage and periodicity of updates of the data;
    - b) Additional specifications to areas/sectors/project types for which the guidelines are applicable; and
    - c) Other issues arising out analysis by the secretariat and public consultation.
  - The Board may wish to task the secretariat to launch a call for public inputs on the guidelines.
