UNITED NATIONS FRAMEWORK CONVENTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE

The CMP at its fifth session (Dec 2009) requested the JISC to report to the CMP at its sixth session on its experiences with the joint implementation verification procedure under the Committee, with a view to making improvements for the future operation of JI, taking into account relevant decisions of the CMP at its fifth session.

- The JISC has had more than three years of experience with the verification procedure
- The various stakeholders have undertaken their various roles and actions over the last few years as well
- Numerous interactions between the JISC and stakeholders have taken place

Comprehensive

- Experience of JISC
- Experience of stakeholders
- Experience of support structure including secretariat
- Joint Implementation mechanisms overall (track 2 as well as interrelationship with track 1)

Overall as well as issue specific experiences

Possible changes to consider

- Immediate to be considered by JISC as appropriate
- Changes the CMP could consider with present verification procedure
- Possible improvements to mechanisms the CMP could consider with a view to the future

Prior to JISC 22

- Public call for inputs on experiences and possible improvements to the mechanism
- Secretariat (with selected members?) prepare a background paper
- Include matter in round table consultations in June

JISC 22

- Consider public inputs, secretariat background paper, inputs from round table consultations
- Agree on final structure/content & request secretariat in consultations with several JISC members to prepare draft

JISC 23

- Consider draft report and agree on report for forwarding to CMP6
