BACKGROUND

- CMP 6 (Nov-Dec 2010)
 - Requested the JISC to implement action area IV of “JI experience report” in particular:
 - (a) Further improving the JISC verification procedure (Track 2 procedure) by:
 - i. Enhancing the clarity of documents
 - ii. Setting time limits in the JI project cycle
 - iii. Making use of electronic decision making
 - iv. Encouraging and supporting innovative methodological approaches



i) Enhancing clarity of documents

JISC workplan 2011-2013

Action 6: Revising relevant policy guidance documents by:

- a) Ensuring consistent definition of “JI project” and “project”
 - b) Avoiding duplications, repetitions and inconsistencies between documents on baseline and monitoring
 - c) Applying the concept of materiality in establishing project boundary and estimating leakage
 - d) Clarifying the option in baseline setting of JI-specific approach already taken in “comparable cases”
 - e) Clarifying which CDM additionality tool and guidelines are applicable
 - f) Clarifying the use of English language, confidentiality requirements and possibility of modifying JI-PDD form
 - g) Implementing editorial changes in the guidelines for users of PDD form
 - h) Merging “Guidance on criteria for baseline setting and monitoring” and “Guidelines for users of JI PDD form” into a “PDD Manual”

ii) Setting time limits in the JI project cycle

Action 7: Exploring possible setting of time limit or expectations for each phase of the JI project cycle, in particular the time between publication of a PDD and when its determination is deemed final, through, among others, the revision of the review process

Action 8: Making use of electronic decision-making, in particular in relation to reviews

iv) Encouraging and supporting innovative methodological approaches

Action 9: Considering revisions of guidance to encourage and support simple and innovative methodological approaches including:

- a) Application of standardized baselines and default values
- b) Streamlined demonstration of additionality (e.g. positive list)
- c) Allowing multiple measures in a single project
- d) Further developing programmatic approaches



Issue for consideration at JISC 24

1. Agreement on specific areas of actions
2. Prioritization of actions in terms of timing and resources
3. Modalities of work (e.g. who, public consultation process)
