Finance for Climate Change Mitigation and MRV

JBIC will provide financing to GHG emission reduction projects through GREEN which is a JBIC's new financial program. At COP15 in Copenhagen last December, Japan announced Hatoyama Initiative which will provide USD 15 billion to climate change mitigation and adaptation until 2012 and among them USD 4 billion will be mobilized by Public Private Finance. GREEN will implement an important part of Hatoyama Initiative. JBIC will review 1) host country climate change policy, 2) technology at the project, 3) amount of GHG emission reduction by projects when JBIC finance them through GREEN. For the measurement of the amount of GHG emission reduction by projects, JBIC has fixed up J-MRV under the support of 6 experts in CDM and ISO and it is understood that J-MRV should be simple, practical and also internationally acceptable.

In this seminar, JBIC will introduce J-MRV and discuss about the potential of it, including its contribution to create new market based incentive system. It will show that JBIC's aim is on the direction to scale up low carbon society.

JBIC will continue to improve J-MRV through dialogues with carbon market players, investors and governments.
